# Return to Play

2020 has been an unprecedented and challenging year for individuals, organizations and the entire world.

In the beginning of the pandemic, BlazeSports shut down temporarily. We then began the transition of taking as many of our programs virtual as possible. Participation in the core BlazeSports programs stayed strong throughout the summer. Beginning in July of 2020, with guidance from the CDC and Department of Public Health, we began a plan to safely and gradually return to play.

Decisions on Return to Play were made based on science, guidance from the CDC and state and local public health officials as well as National Governing Bodies for each sport.

We began to officially Return to Play by offering select low-risk sports in small groups of 10 that can be enjoyed outdoors with masks required. All Return to Play programs were open only to current BlazeSports youth and veteran members. At the end of the year, we had safely returned to play in most, but not all of the BlazeSports programs. Programs like bowling and on-water rowing are in the works to safely return to play when the guidance allows.

The 2020 BlazeSports Big Peach Slam Jam presented by the Atlanta Hawks was the largest tournament of its kind in the Southeast.
